Knight of Columbus Pilgrimage is Welcomed with Gratitude

The New York State Knights of Columbus will pilgrimage to the Shrine for their 81st year on Sept 7 (see sidebar for schedule). Since its inception, the Shrine has been the beneficiary of the Knights' generosity from local, state, and national levels.

Among their gifts is the domed 1885 Chapel which sheltered the first Mass celebrated here on August 15, 1885. The Knights also financed its restoration in 1926 and 2008. Plaques inside the Chapel honor their contribution and those of the first Jesuits and pilgrims.

The Monument to the Unborn on the hill near the Coliseum, dedicated in 1994, was initiated and financed by the efforts of the Knights. It commemorates the innocents lost to abortion, and demonstrates the Knights' commitment to Catholic teaching on the sanctity of human life. (See sidebar for Sept 14 National Day of Remembrance at the monument).

The Knights rescued the Coliseum with major repairs a number of times, including 2015 when Supreme Knight Carl Anderson arrived at the Shrine with a \$500,000 donation for new roof and windows. This was in addition to the \$100,000 from the New York State Knights.

Our Lady of Martyrs Shrine Council is now located in the former Martyrs Museum/Library. Their presence and projects show the devotion of the entire Knight of Columbus to this holy ground and their support of the Friends of Our Lady of Martyrs Shrine.
