Auriesville, New York
The Holy Ground of the North American Martyrs
and Birthplace of St. Kateri Tekakwitha

When the Jesuits 'bought the farm' which is the holy ground of Auriesville, they built a domed, round chapel to accommodate the altar, celebrant, and altar server. They celebrated the first Mass on the Feast of the Assumption, 1885, since St. Isaac Jogues and St. René Goupil had arrived here as prisoners on the Eve of this Feast Day in 1642. Could they have anticipated that 4000 people would attend! They came by horse and buggy, by rail, barge, and on foot, dressed in their Sunday best in the heat of summer without a stick of shade.

Comfort level is substantially higher now. So join us on August 4 for the Traditional Latin Mass, as would have been celebrated in 1885. Bring a lawn chair or blanket to sit on. For schedule, see sidebar.

In the Museum

EWTN viewers are familiar with the religious order, the Fathers of Mercy (CPM), from programs with Father Wade Menezes. Father Wade's superior, and Superior General of the entire order, visited the Saints of Auriesville Museum. Very Rev David Wilton, CPM, is from Jefferson County in the northern reaches of NYS. On pilgrimage with his siblings, he explained that their aunt married a Mohawk, a talented wood sculptor, who donated many pieces to churches and shrines. Although the museum did not have the nearly life-sized carving of St. Kateri they were trying to locate, our docent showed them the only two wood carvings in the museum. One was the face of an Indian. She took it from its place in the Mohawk venue: "The only things on the back are the initials: 'M.T.'" "That's him!" they said nearly in unison. Uncle Michael Terrance. Another talented, devoted artist and lover of St. Kateri was identified. And Father Wilton will keep us in mind for pilgrimage!



The museum also welcomed Bishop Paul Sanchez, Auxiliary Bishop of Brooklyn, who was on pilgrimage with family.
