The Latin Masses that were included in our Novena of Masses for the Assumption were well received with reverence and interest. Continuing that tradition, Father Roger Landry will have a <u>Latin Mass</u> on Sunday Sept 12 in addition to the 3pm Novus Ordo <u>Mass</u>



Sept 14&15 honor Our Lord and Our Lady in their suffering and the abundant fruit it produces. The Exultation of the Cross is a Feast Day to remind us that Jesus brought redemption and life through his suffering and death. The former Mohawk village of Ossernenon, located here at the Shrine, has been called the "Land of Crosses." <u>Reflections</u> will be offered on the constant presence of the cross and its life-giving message through the sufferings and deaths of the Martyrs, followed by <u>Holy Hour and Mass.</u>

With the Blessed Mother always close by, the Memorial Mass for Our Lady of Sorrows is celebrated the following day. The Shrine now has an original trifold of <u>The Seven</u> <u>Sorrows of Mary with St Isaac Jogues.</u> Parallels in their ordeals of violence and grief is highlighted. After <u>Mass</u>, this will be prayed at the Seven Sorrows monuments (L) on the holy ground.

The National Day of Remembrance for the Unborn is observed at burial sites and memorials for the millions of babies lost to abortion. Thanks to the Knights of Columbus, there is such a monument here at the Shrine on the hilltop behind the Coliseum (R). "By participating, you are helping to humanize our aborted brothers and sisters and deepening your own commitment to ending the injustice of abortion." 
